The campaign was organised in collaboration with the Blood Donation Centre, Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Saleha (RIPAS) Hospital.


Each of the blood donors also received one free limited edition Burger King T-shirt.

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Rotary Club of BSB to hold blood donation campaign this weekend

"LET'S join hands to save lives by donating blood," said President Lam Soon Meng, Rotary Club of BSB's Blood Donation Campaign Coordinator, of the upcoming blood donation campaign at the Lexus Showroom.

"The Rotary Club of Bandar Seri Begawan and the Mobile Blood Bank, Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Saleha (RIPAS) Hospital, will once again be jointly holding a blood donation campaign on September 16, from 9am to 2pm, at the Lexus Showroom, Gadong, to make it easy, comfortable and convenient for donors to perform this ultimate act of human kindness," he further said, according to a press release.

"Together we can spread the message far and wide - to make a big difference in our community."

Haji Matusop bin Haji Daud, a supervisor at RIPAS Hospital's Blood Donation Centre, emphasised that every donation can potentially save three lives.

"Besides, every donor will be

given a free health test (blood pressure, haemoglobin count), infectious disease screening, such as for HIV, Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C and Syphilis," he said.

"In addition, research has shown that if you donate blood regularly two to three times a year - there is less risk of cancer and also heart attacks.

"You will also lose around 500 calories per donation.

"A person weighing 68 kilogrammes, for example, would have to run for about 45 minutes at a 6.2-minute-per-kilometre pace to burn 500 calories.

"This is roughly the equivalent of two hours of social badminton, so blood donation can be part of a healthy and fit lifestyle, besides saving lives.

"Therefore, all are welcome to the Lexus Showroom on Saturday, September 16, from 9am to 2pm," he added

"Light refreshments will be served.

"All are welcome."
